

Highlights of the Magna Charta Universitatum 2023 Anniversary



The Magna Charta Universitatum MCU2020 Anniversary 2023 took place from October 23rd to 25th at the University of Lodz, Poland. The event was an opportunity for higher education representatives from all over the world to come together and discuss pressing topics in the area and network. The event culminated in the Ceremony for the Signature of the Magna Charta Universitatum MCU2020. This year 35 universities from 12 different countries signed this important document, declaring their commitment to principles such as the defense of academic freedom and the promotion of the well being of the communities in their surroundings.

This year's theme, "Universities and Re-Construction of Cities: the Role of Research and Education," explored the crucial role played by Higher Education Institutions in transforming cities under various circumstances, from post-war re-construction, as seen in Ukraine and many other countries, to adapting to the changing tides of industry and society. The audience had the opportunity to hear from specialists on the field and also from students their perspectives on the topic.

The MCU 2023 Anniversary was also marked by the increased presence of students, marking the deepening in the connection between the Magna Charta Observatory (MCO) and the interests of students.

The session titled "Regional Perspectives on Universities Serving Societies: Challenges and Responses", which delved into the Higher Education landscape and current issues in Poland and Ukraine, had the participation of two student representatives from Ukraine. They shared their perspectives and outlined the actions undertaken by the student organization they were representing in the context of the ongoing challenges in the region.

The anniversary also featured the winners of the first MCO Student Essay Competition on several occasions. Not only did they have the opportunity to participate in the three-day event and receive their certificates in front of a large audience during the Ceremony for the Signature of the Magna Charta Universitatum MCU2020 but also showcased their winning essays on the theme "How might students exercise more influence in enabling their universities to make a more effective contribution to society?" during a World Café Session.

Finally, during the MCU 2023 Anniversary, MCO and the Global Students Forum (GSF) formalized a memorandum of understanding, which cemented the relationship between the two organizations and their commitment to collaborate in the future to enhance student involvement in governance and policy-making within higher education and contribute to the protection and advancement of the principles contained on Magna Charta Universitatum MCU 2020.

Keynotes

The Keynotes session featured Ed Brinksma (President of the UNIC), Rahman Elfihi (Chief of Section Capacity Development, and Water Family Coordination of Unesco) and Brendan O'Malley (Editor of University World News), discussing the role of education and research for promoting the common good. Read here some highlights of this interesting session:

Ed Brinksma, while discussing the case of three European universities located in regions affected by external events in the 20th Century, such as the destruction of the World War and changes in the economic sector, highlighted the importance of the universities in revitalizing the economy and promoting urban transformation. Moreover, he addressed the challenges of the interaction between universities and communities, given the different forms of knowledge. Brinksma also highlighted the necessity of a multidisciplinary approach involving various stakeholders to address the challenges of the 21st Century.

Rahman Elfihi, in discussing the challenges of research in the water sector, emphasized the importance of creating networks to increase the effectiveness of actions.

Brendan O'Malley delivered a powerful speech examining the role of education in promoting peace. He provided statistics on attacks on Higher Education Institutions in recent years and discussed how education can contribute to conflicts. During his speech he affirmed: "If you want to prevent education from being attacked, which can also mean to be available to play a key role in reconstruction, you first need to understand not just the methods but the motives of the attackers". Webinar: Engagement with Civil Society: Experience from Latin America on 6th December 2023

Latin America is currently experiencing a renewed interest in the diverse ways in which higher education institutions can contribute to democratic development through closer engagement with civil society. The "university extension" movement, dating back to the early 1900s, is undergoing a revival that is significantly enhancing the democratic mission of the university.

Organized in cooperation with the Global Cooperation for the Democratic Mission of Higher Education, this webinar aims to offer firsthand perspectives from Latin American countries, allowing their experiences to become part of the global dialogue regarding the democratic mission of the university and how it can best engage with its local community and civil society.

The webinar will be moderated by Ronaldo Munck, Head of Civic Engagement at Dublin City University in Ireland and co-editor (along with Yadira Pinilla, Rita Hodges, and Catherine Bartch) of the book "Higher Education in Latin America and the Caribbean: Civic Engagement and the Democratic Mission."

Save the Date: London Mansion House Event on 9th May 2024


