The World Café Session is a special event during the MCU Anniversary celebration.

With 12 tables, accommodating up to 10 participants each, this session fosters dynamic discussions on various current topics related to the conference theme.

This setup encourages intimate and participatory discussions between the table host (speaker) and participants. Each participant is invited to take part in up to 3 sessions, each lasting 50 minutes.

Some of this year's tables are:

- Building back sustainably: University engagement with the Sustainable Development Goals for research and teaching for reconstruction
- Building Equity and Fairness into reconstruction activities (with special reference to Gender)
- The role of digitally enhanced education in enhancing the resilience of a HEI and a university community
- Improving the research environment in Africa and fostering the connection between African universities.

Essay Competition




The results of the first Magna Charta Observatory Students' Essay Competition are now available!
